## HAZARD HOUSE



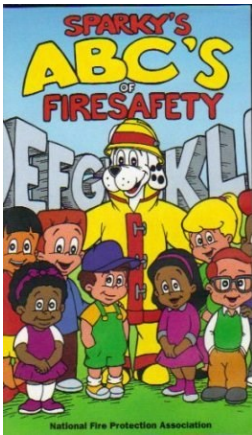
The North Perth Fire Department purchased this Hazard House in memory of fallen firefighters Ken Rae and Ray Walter. It is portable and much like a doll house with working smoke alarms.

The hazard house presentations work best for groups of 30 or less and can be tailored for any age range.

Discussion topics include: smoke alarms, home escape planning, matches and lighter safety, kitchen hazards, and many more.

Duration of presentation depends on student participation but is approximately 45 minutes.

## "No Dragons for Tea" & "Sparky's ABC's"

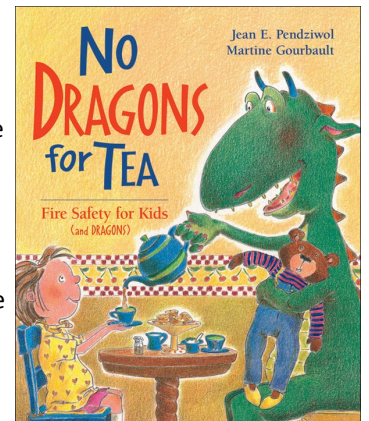


These two resources are excellent for younger audiences, JK—Gr 1.

Sparky's ABC's is a video featuring everyone's favourite fire safety dog, Sparky. He teaches participants about different fire hazards that can be found in their homes, as well as the importance of smoke alarms and home escape plans.

No Dragons for Tea is an entertaining rhyming book that teaches the students about the dangers of fire and the importance of having smoke alarms and knowing their home escape plans.

Duration: Approx. 15 minutes each (recommended to be presented 1 at a time).



## FIRE HALL TOURS



Fire Hall Tours can be arranged at any time of year for any age range of students.

Tours involve an instructional piece as well as the opportunity for students to see the equipment firefighters use.

While tours have traditionally been enjoyed by primary grades, consider involving older students who may be interested in pursuing firefighting as a career.

Duration: approximately 1 hour.
